Director's Report

This year has again been a busy one for the School of Nursing. The School Executive Committee is now stable. Dr. Kirsten Woodend, the Director and Associate Dean started her second year in the role. Dr. Betty Cragg and Dr Jocelyne Tourigny continue as Assistant Directors of the undergraduate and graduate programs respectively.

A number of changes to our programs have been approved by Senate this year: 1) the new second entry baccalaureate program, 2) the new MScN with a concentration in Primary Care Nurse Practitioner, and 3) the new doctoral fields. This fall we will be admitting the last students to the English Baccalaureate for Registered Nurses which cease entirely in 2014.

Two new professors joined the School in July of 2007. H el ene Laperri ere obtained her doctorate in public health (Health Promotion) as well as a micro-doctoral program in analysis and evaluation of health interventions

(An eis) at the University of Montreal. Marie-Claude Thifault completed a doctorate in history in 2003. She worked as a nurse in psychiatry for several year which led to her interest in the history of asylums, the subject of her book *Une toup ee sur la t ete* (finalist for the Governor General's literary award in 2007). Dr. Josephine Etowa was also hired in 2008 and she will be joining us in July of 2009.

In addition to all of the work on the new baccalaureate curriculum this year, the members of the School: 1) revised the School Bylaws, 2) have developed a strategic plan for the years 2008-2012, 3) have drafted a School statement on tenure and promotion and 4) and made initial revisions to the School of Nursing web site.

Two of our colleagues received tenure and promotion to the rank of Associate Professor this year (Dr. Susan Brajtman et Dr. Cynthia Toman). Dr.

Dave Holmes was promoted to full professor and Dr Nancy Edwards was named Distinguished Professor of the University of Ottawa. The University has also reconstructed a space on the first floor of the Roger Guindon building to house the Nursing Best Practice Unit faculty; research assistants and students should occupy this space in the summer of 2008.

2008 is the 75th anniversary of the School of Nursing. We started our celebrations, at the SON/Tau Gamma annual research conference on May 9th, with coffee, cake and a presentation by Dr. Meryn Stuart on the history of the School. The main celebration will be a gala during homecoming week in September, and the launch of a new nursing peer reviewed journal, APORIA.

Baccalaureate Program for Registered Nurses

The Program committee only met twice during the year, since most of the decisions about the program were pending approval. The following changes have now been approved:

Closure of the Anglophone Post RN program. As of May 2009, no more admissions will be accepted into the Anglophone Post RN program. Admission applications have decreased 68% over the past five years, and even with the announcement of pending closure, the application rates were not significantly increased this year. Planning for phase out, especially in the distance sites, will begin in the fall when we know students' locations and interest in electives.

Breastfeeding course: The course in French and the new English course description have passed the Senate. Planning is underway to develop the course in French as an on-line offer-

ing.

Combining gerontology courses:

Two of the courses in the gerontology concentration NSG 4306 and 4316 have been combined into a new course, NSG 4319: Concepts and strategies for care of the elderly, that reflects the content of the previous courses. Palliative care has been added as a concentration requirement, along with the three credit clinical course.

Combining of clinical courses: Because few students enroll in clinical courses, the separate clinical courses in each of the concentrations have been combined into one course code. This change gives us flexibility in assigning professors when concentrations with similar issues—e.g. palliative care and geriatrics are involved. There will be different sections for different concentrations, depending

on demand.

The francophone program will continue to accept applications; however, interest has been limited. There have been only 19 applications so far for this year. More aggressive recruitment will be necessary next year. Work was done this year to find suitable nursing electives in French which are available from other universities by distance. A new course in the History of Nursing was offered for the first time for this group of students.

A new distance site has been opened at Winchester. This will provide an opportunity for nurses in the area South of Ottawa to complete their Post RN degrees before the program closes.

Collaborative Baccalaureate Program

The collaborative baccalaureate program (La Cité collégiale, Algonquin College, Collège universitaire St-Boniface et Université d'Ottawa) welcomed the first cohort of students into the new curriculum. In September 2007, the first year of the new program, students take social sciences, humanities and science courses and nursing courses now start in year two of the program. The School has organized activities for the first year students to help them develop a sense of belonging to the School of Nursing. Last April a questionnaire was sent to all first year students to get their feedback on their first year and their suggestions on how to improve connections with the first year students next year. Results of the survey will be available shortly.

The new Second Entry program in English started on May 1st (total of 24 students). This program is for students who have completed at least 60 university credits of university level study with certain prerequisites. During the summer semester they will be completing the year two nursing and science courses and enter year three in September. Due to low registration the program in French will start next

year.

Last September 2007, La Cité collégiale started the program for The Aca-

ademic Pathway for the Registered Practical Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing in French (total of 10 students). The Academic Pathways for the Registered Practical Nurse and for the International Educated Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing in English at the Algonquin campus were modified to reflect the changes to the new curriculum.

The Curriculum Day was held on May

27th; faculty from all sites and agency partners attended (total of 50 participants). An update on the new curriculum program was presented. The different curriculum working groups, specific to

three, presented a summary of their work including course outlines, key concepts, and teaching and evaluation strategies.

This year, four professional development activities for the professors were organized. An orientation day for the part-time professors was held August 29th (total of 42 participants). On December 18th, the legal counsel from University of Ottawa gave a presentation on the applica-

tion of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act in our academic setting. A workshop on simulation was offered on February 20th (a total of 15 participants). On May 7th, the professors were invited to a workshop on an end-of-life care education of students (a total of 30 participants).

The accreditation review by the Canadian Association of Schools of Nursing (CASN) is planned for winter 2009 for our baccalaureate programs.

For the school year 2007-2008, we had a total of 1296 students registered in the Collaborative Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program: 268 students in the French program and 512 students in the English program University of Ottawa campus, 425 students at the Algonquin campus, 76 at the Pembroke campus, and 15 students at the Collège universitaire St-Boniface.

Graduate Programs

The graduate studies programs have been evolving since their creation and particularly the doctoral program which started in 2004. The number of students admitted to the various programs has continued to grow in the course of the previous three years; we now have 21 students at the doctoral level as well as 104 students in the master's program. The students who take courses at distance account for 30% of the graduate student population.

The doctoral program with its three fields was approved by the Ontario Council of Graduate Studies and by the University's Senate, along with a concentration in primary care nurse practitioner as part of the masters of science in nursing. This last permits nurses to become advanced practice nurses while fulfilling the role of nurse practitioner in various primary health care settings.

Other graduate level courses were developed and offered including a course in statistics for nurses, a course on the role of educator for advanced practice nurses and an interdisciplinary

nary course in palliative care. The content of the graduate web site has been updated and adapted to meet the needs of both students and professors. A new School web site will be in place in 2009.

Our students obtained numerous scholarships from the University as well as from major funding organizations such as the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada and the Canadian Institutes of Research.

Our research units, such as the Community Health Research Unit, the Decision Support Group, the Nursing Best Practice Research Unit, and the Unit for Critical Research in Health, have been very active in the education of students as well as in disseminating the results of their research. Another research unit, the AMS Nursing History Research Unit has also shared their expertise by giving two presentations in the context of the School's annual research conference.

The members of the Graduate Program Committee met seven times in

the course of the school year and have initiated the adoption of new courses, reviewed and approved policies and forms related to the comprehensive examination, thesis committees and editing of theses. In the spring of 2008, the members evaluated more than 130 requests for admission to our various graduate programs.

I would like to thank all of the members of the Graduate Program Committee for their work and their support. I would also like to thank all of the professors for the excellent contributions to our programs.

Primary Care Nurse Practitioner

The Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner (PHCNP) Program, in the 07-08 academic year, admitted eight Anglophone and two Francophone students into the Combined MScN/NP. In addition 20 Anglophone and eight Francophone students were admitted to the NP Certificate. During this academic year 26 Anglophone and 11 Francophone learners are studying to become nurse practitioners at the University of Ottawa. These students join 275 Students provincially who are taking PHCNP courses.

The program has implemented a virtual classroom delivery method using

a program called Elluminate using the internet to deliver courses to distance students.

Senate approval has been obtained for the delivery of a Masters in Nursing, Concentration PHCNP, which will start in September 2008. Approval has also been obtained for a Graduate PHCNP Diploma, which will be available in September 2009. The seven graduate level nurse practitioner courses will continue to be delivered by the consortium of nine universities. At the University of Ottawa students will take these Masters core courses; Methods and Interpretation of Quantitative Research

Recruitment Committee

The recruitment committee had many priorities for the 2007-2008 school year. Graduate student recruitment was emphasized at local and national conferences, with a focus on full-time students who would be eligible for scholarships. Francophone student recruitment was done actively for all programs, including the Francophone Post RN program.

Aboriginal student recruitment included developing linkages with local and regional Aboriginal communities (e.g. Grand Council of the Crees - Eeyou Istchee, Golden Lake, Akwesasne), seeking funding and developing links with the uOttawa Indigenous Medical Student Program.

As part of Tenure track faculty recruitment a faculty recruitment flyer was

developed for distribution. We continue to actively work on recruiting new tenure track faculty at conferences.

The design of the new School of Nursing Generic and Graduate roll-ups was completed. No generic or graduate students have been found to serve on the Recruitment Committee for the upcoming year. The funds from a budget miscalculation in the 2006/07 fiscal year were carried forward into this past year, 2007/08, and will be carried forward into 2008/09 to pay for a new School of Nursing roll-it-up and specific Aboriginal student recruitment activities. All allocated funds for this committee were spent on various activities over the year.

The Committee has many priorities for

the upcoming year (2008/09), including: 1) continuing to attend regional and national conferences and hospitals to recruit for all programs, especially for Francophone students, 2) continuing to actively recruit Aboriginal students for all programs and develop Aboriginal student funding initiatives (e.g. seek funding for a University access program in collaboration with FHS and the Indigenous Medical Student Program), 3) actively recruiting new tenure track faculty at National and International conferences, 4) finding student representatives to serve on the committee, and 5) continuing to recruit International students for all programs

Nominations Committee

In September, elections were also organized to determine the student representatives on School Council, Graduate Program Committee and the Recruitment Committee.

At the end of the 2007-2008 academic year, two members completed their mandates on the Graduate Program Committee, one faculty member and one joint appointee, and these were replaced.

At the Faculty committee level, four members completed their mandates and three accepted to renew.

The professors have demonstrated a high level of engagement and support for committees both at the School and Faculty levels. There are five new members of committees at these levels despite the additional work this represents.

Research Unit Reports

Nursing Best Practice Research Unit

The Nursing Best Practice Research Unit, officially launched March 2007, is a partnership between the Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario and the University of Ottawa, School of Nursing. Our strategic goals include developing and evaluating clinical and healthy work place guidelines, building capacity for the implementation and evaluation of guidelines, developing and refining evaluation measures,

and refining approaches to synthesize research findings to enhance practice.

To achieve our goals we are creating a network of researchers, health care professionals, policy makers, educators, students, health care organizations and professional associations to promote evidence-informed nursing practice. In 2007-2008, our 33 individual members conducted 50 funded research projects and published 80

papers, (see our inaugural annual report). Our special news is the construction of a new physical space at Roger Guindon Hall with offices for research staff, graduate students, and faculty members

Nursing History Research Unit

The Associated Medical Services Nursing History Research Unit supports the production and dissemination of new knowledge in Canadian nursing history through education, research, and public outreach. In January 2008, Cynthia Toman and Marie-Claude Thifault launched an online course on the history of nursing in Canada in English and French, respectively. These courses were well received by the undergraduate students enrolled. Tina Bates, curator of the exciting nursing history exhibit held at the Canadian Museum of Civilization in 2005-06, presented the results of her research on early nursing uniforms to

interested faculty and students at the

Unit's spring seminar in April.

All members of the Unit, including our postdoctoral fellow, Sarah Glassford, taught at our second annual intensive summer practicum in historical re-

search methodology in May. Jayne Elliot, Meryn Stuart and Cynthia Toman have edited the Unit's first publication, *Place and Practice in Canadian Nursing History*, which is due to be released late fall 2008 by UBC Press. Meryn Stuart is leading a team of seven co-investigators (including Cynthia Toman) from across the country into the third year of a SSRCC-funded research project to study the history of nurses and their work within the cultures of colonialism and nationalism. Finally, Cynthia Toman received the Hilda Neatby prize in women's history for her 2007 article in *Histoire sociale/Social History*.

Decision Support Research Unit

The investigators and staff of the Ottawa Health Decision Centre (OHDeC) design and test decision aids and training programs for patients and health practitioners. OHDeC also evaluates new delivery strategies for patient decision aids in Ottawa and Internationally in the UK, US and Chile.

We maintain a popular decision website which includes a global inventory of patient decision aids, as well as our conceptual framework, evaluation measures, quality monitoring and feedback tools, auto-tutorial training and e-course. This year the website welcomed 68,307 visitors and was highlighted in an editorial published in the BMJ.

The main highlights in 2007-8 include:

- Advising on the wording of a Washington State Senate Bill (5930) regarding informed con-

sent and shared decision making. The bill was passed on May 2, 2007; The Washington health Care authority will implement a shared decision-making demonstration project incorporating decision aids into clinical practice and evaluating the impact of the use of shared decision making (<http://apps.leg.wa.gov/billinfo/summary.aspx?bill=5930&year=2007>).

- Leading and participating in the 2007 Summer Institute for Informed Patient Choice (SIIPC) at Dartmouth Medical School in Hanover, NH. The objective of the Institute was to identify and mentor the next

generation of scientists studying healthcare decision making.

- Launching a trial evaluating the integration of decision aids and surgeon's reports on patients' preferences at the Ottawa Hospital Orthopedic Intake clinic.

International Unit for Research, Education, and Development in Health

Committee Activities

The Committee is finalizing its terms of reference regarding its role in international research, education, and development and student exchanges. Members from each school have met regularly for strategic planning. It was agreed that each school would develop partnerships with international universities to augment and enhance studies in their programs. Each school has documented its involvement in international work in developed as well as low and middle income countries.

School of Nursing Activities

The School of Nursing receives numerous requests from developed and developing countries to participate in various educational and research initiatives. Faculty have met to prioritize these requests. International objectives have been included in the School's new strategic plan.

Faculty members are currently involved in several international partnerships: Brajtman (Israel); Davies (China); Edwards and Legault (Uganda, Kenya, South Africa, Jamaica

and Barbados); Laperrière (Brazil); O'Connor and Stacey (Chile, Wales); Polomeno (Washington, USE); Stuart and Toman (UK, USA, Europe). Smith and Langford are working with First Nations communities to promote the BScN program.

Students (five HSS and four NSG) in HSS 4933 International Health Practicum (Spring/Summer 2008) have placements organized in Ecuador, El Salvador, Jamaica, Uganda and Pikwanaganan First Nations in Ontario.
